

Labor market regulations

- > Switzerland and Sweden: flexible
- Italy: rigid
- > France, Germany, and Poland: intermediate

General political opportunity structure

- Switzerland: open
- > France, Sweden, and Poland: closed
- > Germany and Italy: intermediate

Unemployment-specific opportunities

- Germany and Switzerland: numerous
- > Italy: scarce
- > France, Poland, and Sweden: intermediate

Opportunities in related issue-fields

- > France, Germany, and Sweden: numerous
- > Italy, Poland, and Switzerland: scarce


Location of the cities within unemployment welfare regimes


